

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

2020 was a year of opportunity and transition for Vamos Outdoors Project, responding to the emergent needs and inequities facing the Latinx/ELL/Migrant communities in Whatcom and Skagit County. Vamos began 2020 with one part-time employee, running programs with the support of volunteers. Our swimming lessons and indoor rock climbing programs ran January through March. We finished just as COVID began to adjust the way of life all across the globe. With programming canceled for the foreseeable future, Vamos had to think creatively to continue to meet the needs of the communities served.

Vamos created new partnerships with Bellingham Public Schools, Burlington-Edison School District, hired another permanent employee, hired 11 temporary employees to support programming, and developed new relationships with other outdoors organizations, all with the goals of building community and outdoors access for Latinx, ELL, and Migrant youth and families in Whatcom and Skagit Counties.

Vamos recognizes the strife and inequality that was brought front and center into the mainstream dialogue in America after the murder of George Floyd and other black people by police officers. The same systems of oppression that violence black people also violence Latinx and migrant communities. Black

Skagit County Programming!



Vamos began providing programming at Northern State Recreation Area, our first time working in Skagit County. Vamos partnered with Burlington-Edison School District's Gear-Up program to provide outdoor activities for middle school youth. Program goals were to increase outdoor social interactions, increase healthy habits, and connect youth to the land.

FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

Vamos Outdoors Project greatly increased our programming capacity through increases in revenue in 2020. Vamos' 2019 revenue was \$18,000. In 2020 Vamos brought in \$137,000 through grants, contracts, and donations. Thanks to all of you who supported Vamos Outdoors Project. Your contributions are appreciated, and we hope you continue to support our work.

Vamos spent \$81,000 in 2020. Many of our grants and contributions were provided or re-allocated as general operating dollars to build organizational capacity. We are excited to use this funding as we can more safely interact with community members and staff.

We also want to recognize all of our volunteers and community supports. Thanks to you for donating your time and efforts. To the teachers from BPS who supported our programs to the bikers and swimmers and climbers that shared joy in activities, we thank you.
